Here are some ways you can leverage Rally to Read in your classroom.

Read-aloud videos

All-star authors have recorded fun, Rally to Read-specific read-alouds of their popular books. These videos let students hear the story with the author's intended intonation, pacing, and fluency. To support fluency, consider having students listen to the story multiple times: first with the author video, then with the teacher modeling fluent reading, and finally with the student reading independently at a center or at home. Repeated readings build confidence, comprehension, and oral fluency.

- Indoor recess

- Designated read-aloud time
- During content area instruction if related to the topic

Thematic book lists & activity packets
